Summer Events Programme 2001–02

Friday 9 November 2001 National Push Play Day

Pencarrow Lighthouse Sunset Trip

East Harbour Regional Park - 4.30pm start for walkers, 5.30pm start for cyclists

"Push Play" is the Hillary Commission campaign to get people to exercise for 30 minutes a day. Join with us, Sport Wellington Region, Historic Places Trust and Hutt City Council to learn about our rich maritime history and enjoy dramatic views on the eastern coastline of Wellington Harbour. A long (14km) but easy walk (4-hours return) or bike-ride (2-hour return) from Burdans Gate along the gravel coast road. A short climb leads up to the historic 1859 Pencarrow Lighthouse. Bring warm clothes and drinking water. No doas please.

HOW TO GET THERE: Take an Eastbourne bus to the terminal at the end of Muritai Road - then a short walk (400m) to Burdans Gate. Alternatively, catch the East by West ferry (cycles carried) from Queens Wharf, across the Harbour to Days Bay then catch a bus from there. By car, travel from Wellington via State Highway 2, Petone Esplanade, Seaview Road and Eastern Bays Marine Drive through Eastbourne to the end of Muritai Road.

Saturday 10 November 2001 Beacon Hill Harbour Highlights

Seatoun - 10am and 2pm starts (30 min visit)

Learn about maritime operations and enjoy stunning views of Wellington Harbour from the historic 1864 Signal Station. Beacon Hill provides a 24-hour communications service for harbour users. We keep an eye on commercial and recreational harbour activities and maintain navigation aids to assist vessels in all weathers. If you have time, extend your visit and explore the Eastern Walkway. Maximum of 10 people per visit, not suitable for children under 8. Bookings are essential, telephone 526 4133 during office hours.

HOW TO GET THERE: Catch a No. 30 Seatoun bus to Broadway then walk up to Beacon Hill. Meet at Paratu Grove. Drive to Beacon Hill via Tio Tio Road (off Broadway). Only very limited parking at Beacon Hill and Signallers Grove. Steps lead up to the signal station so it is not suitable for wheelchairs and prams.

Sunday 18 November 2001

Karori Wonderful Water Walk 1



Karori Wildlife Sanctuary - 10.30am start

Join us for a series of guided walks to water supply dams in the Wellington area. Derek Wilshere (NZ Society on Large Dams) and Karori Wildlife Sanctuary guides lead us on an easy, scenic walk (2-hours return) to the historic Karori dams (lower 1874 and upper 1908). Wear comfortable shoes and warm clothing. Entry to the Sanctuary is \$6 for adults, \$3 for children, \$15 family, pre-schoolers free. No dogs please.

HOW TO GET THERE: Catch a No. 12 Karori Park bus from the city to the first stop after Karori Tunnel. Karori Wildlife Sanctuary (phone 920 9200) is entered from Waiapu Road, on your left immediately after the tunnel.

Saturday 24 November 2001 Korokoro Wonderful Water Walk 2

Belmont Regional Park - 10am start (Oakleigh Street)

Our next walk with Derek Wilshere explores the historic dams in picturesque Korokoro Valley. A moderate walk (3-4 hours) from Oakleigh Street down to one of New Zealand's first concrete gravity dams - Korokoro Dam and further down Korokoro Stream to the Mill Dam (1903). Exit at Cornish Street, a short walk to Petone Station (or catch a No 53 bus back to Oakleigh Street). Bring sturdy shoes, warm clothes, drinking water, a sun hat and picnic lunch.

HOW TO GET THERE: Catch the 9.05am train from Wellington to Petone and a No. 53 bus to Oakleigh Street. Or travel by car from Wellington via State Highway 2 to the Maungaraki turn-off. Follow Dowse Drive to the top of the hill to reach Oakleigh Street. The carpark is about 4km from SH2.

Saturday 1 December 2001

Historic Coach Road Walk

Belmont Regional Park - 9.30am start from Petone Station (9.45am Normandale Rd)

Come and explore this historic hilltop coach route and wartime Belmont Magazines. An easy 3-hour walk. Take our chartered Cityline bus from Petone Station to top of Normandale Road - walk up Old Coach Road to airstrip/bunkers for lunch - walk back down Hill Road to the bus at 2.00pm. Bus back to Petone Station. Bring sturdy shoes, warm clothes, drinking water, a sun hat and picnic lunch. Maximum 45 people. No charge, but bookings are essential for the bus, telephone 526 4133 during office hours. No dogs please.

HOW TO GET THERE: Catch the 9.05am train from Wellington to Petone and join our chartered Cityline bus to Normandale. Or travel by car from Wellington via State Highway 2 to the Maungaraki turn-off. Follow Dowse Drive and Poto Road to reach Normandale Road. Park at Old Coach Road at the top of Normandale Road (about 6km from SH2).

Saturday 1 December 2001

Small Farmers' Workshop

Battle Hill Farm Forest Park, Pavatahanvi - 10am start

If you own, or want to own, a small block of land then this programme is for you. Norm Cobb, the Battle Hill farmer, will discuss his farming operations and answer your questions about your own block. Bring walking boots, warm clothes, a drink and snack or picnic lunch. No does please.

HOW TO GET THERE: The workshop is held at the Ken Gray Education Centre. Battle Hill Farm Forest Park is located on the Paekakariki Hill Road. It is 6km from State Highway 58 at Payatahanyi. or 10km from State Highway 1 at Paekakariki.

Saturday 8 December 2001

Wetlands Walk

Queen Elizabeth Park, MacKays Crossing, Paekakariki - 10am start

Join WRC wetland specialist Melanie Dixon on a 1.5-hour walk around the wetlands at Queen Elizabeth Park. Learn about wetland plants and animals and gain ideas for wetland restoration projects. Bring sturdy shoes, warm clothes, drinking water, a sun hat and snack or picnic lunch. No dogs please.

HOW TO GET THERE: Queen Elizabeth Park is 45km from Wellington on State Highway 1. Enter the Park at MacKays Crossing, sign posted 3km north of Paekakariki, just over the railway crossing. Meet at the Rangers' Office on your right as you enter the Park.

Saturday 8 December 2001

Wainviomata Wonderful Water Walk 3

Wainuiomata Waterworks - 10am start

Join us for the third trip in our series of guided walks to water supply dams in the Wellington area. Derek Wilshere leads us on a short (2-hour) exploration of the historic (1911) Morton Dam and tour of the Water Treatment Plant. Bring warm clothes, a sun hat, a drink and snack or picnic lunch. Maximum of 30 people, not suitable for children under 7. No charge, but bookings are essential. telephone 526 4133 during office hours. No doas please.

HOW TO GET THERE: Catch the 9.05am train from Wellington to Waterloo Interchange and a No. 62 bus to the end of Hine Road. Walk over the footbridge to Reservoir Road. By car, head through Wainuiomata on Main Road towards the Coast Road. Turn left into Moores Valley Road and then right into Whitcher Grove, which leads to Reservoir Road. Park before the gates.

Sunday 9 December 2001

Birchville Wonderful Water Walk 4

Akatarawa Forest, Upper Hutt - 10am start

Bring the family for this easy (1.5-hour return) walk following the old water pipeline up a bush clad valley to the historic (1929) Birchville Dam. Our friendly guide Derek Wilshere tells us about the first un-reinforced concrete arch dam built for water supply. Bring warm clothes, a sun hat, a drink and snack or picnic lunch. No dogs please.

HOW TO GET THERE: Catch a train to Upper Hutt and No. 12 bus to Birchville. Walk to the end of Bridge Road - car park sign posted Cannon Point Walkway. By car, follow State Highway 2 north of Upper Hutt and turn into Akatarawa Road, which leads to Bridge Road (2.5km).

Wednesday 12 December 2001 Beginners' Guide to the Rainforest

Kaitoke Regional Park, Waterworks Road - 7pm start

Join the Ranger for an easy 1-hour guided walk through beautiful native forest - introducing you to the wonders of Wellington's temperate rainforest. Wear warm clothes and comfortable shoes. (Also Thursday 10 January).

HOW TO GET THERE: Kaitoke Regional Park is 45 km north of Wellington. Follow State Highway 2 and turn left at Waterworks Road 12 km north of Upper Hutt. Drive to the end of the road - signposted as the Pakuratahi Forks car park.

Saturday 5 January 2002 Swingbridge Track Family Quiz

Kaitoke Regional Park, Waterworks Road - 11am start

An easy 1-1.5 hour guided Family Quiz/Nature Discovery walk through beautiful native forest. Bring a pen, warm clothes, drinking water, a sun hat and picnic lunch.

HOW TO GET THERE: See Beginners' Guide to the Rainforest above.

Sunday 6 January 2002 Maori History Walk

Queen Elizabeth Park, MacKays Crossing, Paekakariki - 10am start

Join Miki Rikihana (Te Ati Awa ki Whakarongotai) on an easy 1.5-hour guided walk and discover the fascinating history of how Maori lived at Queen Elizabeth Park. The Park has many archaeological sites located in the coastal dunes. Bring sturdy shoes, warm clothes, drinking water, a sun hat and snack or picnic lunch. (Also Sunday 20 January)

HOW TO GET THERE: Queen Elizabeth Park is 45km from Wellington on State Highway 1. Enter the Park at MacKays Crossing, sign posted 3km north of Paekakariki, just over the railway crossing. Follow the sealed road 2km to Whareroa Beach.

Thursday 10 January 2002 Beginners' Guide to the Rainforest



Kaitoke Regional Park, Waterworks Road - 7pm start

Join the Ranger for an easy 1-hour guided walk through beautiful native forest - introducing you to the wonders of Wellington's temperate rainforest. Wear warm clothes and comfortable shoes.

HOW TO GET THERE: See Beginners' Guide to the Rainforest, Wednesday 12 December.

Saturday 12 January 2002 Bush and Birds

Battle Hill Farm Forest Park, Pavatahanvi - 9am start

Come on a guided walk with the Ranger through the Battle Hill bush reserve. Learn about what's involved in taking back the bush from plant and animal pests. The Ranger will discuss how to maximise seedling regeneration and enhance birdlife. Wear warm clothes and comfortable shoes or boots. Bring a drink and snack or picnic lunch. No dogs please.

HOW TO GET THERE: The trip starts from the Ken Gray Education Centre. Battle Hill Farm Forest Park is located on the Paekakariki Hill Road. It is 6km from State Highway 58 at Pauatahanui, or 10km from State Highway 1 at Paekakariki.

Saturday 12 January 2002 Family Sunset Walk

Queen Elizabeth Park, MacKays Crossing, Paekakariki - 7.30pm start

An easy 1.5-hour guided walk through rolling coastal dunes where we may be treated to one of Kapiti Coast's spectacular sunsets. Bring sturdy shoes, warm clothes and drinking water. (Also Saturday 23 February).

Rimutaka Rail Trail



Pakuratahi Forest, Upper Hutt - 9.15am start

Come on a long (17km), but easy, 5-hour scenic walk to explore some unique railway history. Catch our chartered Cityline bus from Upper Hutt Station or meet us at the Rimutaka Incline carpark (Kaitoke). We walk through to Summit for lunch and down to Cross Creek. Then by bus to visit the Fell Museum at Featherston and return to Upper Hutt. Bring warm clothes, a sun hat, drinks and picnic lunch - a torch is handy for the tunnels. Maximum 90 people, \$10/adult, \$5/child U14. Bookings are essential. telephone 526 4133 during office hours. No doas please.

HOW TO GET THERE: Catch the 8.05am train from Wellington to Upper Hutt Station to meet our chartered Cityline bus departing for Kaitoke at 9am. By car, follow State Highway 2 to the Rimutaka Incline carpark at Kaitoke (9km north of Upper Hutt).

Saturday 26 January 2002

Ridge Track Adventure

Kaitoke Regional Park, Te Marua - 10am start

This moderately demanding walk (10km) through regenerating bush and mature beech forest takes 3-4 hours and gives panoramic views of the Hutt Valley. Bring warm clothes, drinking water, a sun hat and picnic lunch. Transport will be provided back to the start of the track. No dogs please. (Also Saturday 16 March)

HOW TO GET THERE: Catch the 8.05am train from Wellington to Upper Hutt Station to meet the No 12 bus departing for Plateau at 9am. From Te Marua Dairy it is 2.5km walk to the Pumping Station. By car, follow State Highway 2 and bear left at Te Marua, 6 km north of Upper Hutt. Drive past the Pumping Station to the car park at the road end- signposted as the Ridge Track.

Sunday 27 January 2002

Remnant Bush Walk

Queen Elizabeth Park, MacKays Crossing, Paekakariki - 9.30 start

Explore one of the last Kahikatea Dune swamp forests remaining south of the Manawatu. Wander around the remnant and learn about the re-vegetation project undertaken by Forest and Bird Society, Kapiti Environmental Action and the Wellington Regional Council. Bring sturdy shoes, warm clothes, drinking water, a sun hat and snack or picnic lunch. No dogs please.

HOW TO GET THERE: Queen Elizabeth Park is 45km from Wellington on State Highway 1. Enter the Park at MacKays Crossing, sign posted 3km north of Paekakariki, just over the railway crossing. Meet at the Rangers Office on your right as you enter the Park.

Tuesday 29 January 2002

Kaitoke Wonderful Water Walk 5

Kaitoke Regional Park, Waterworks Road - 9am start

An easy 2-hour guided walk and talk about Kaitoke Regional Park's role in the Wellington water supply. Visit Kaitoke Weir and then tour the Te Marua Water Treatment Plant (1-hour) to learn how our drinking water is collected and treated. Wear comfortable shoes and a sun hat. Bring a drink and snack or picnic lunch. Maximum of 30 people, not suitable for children under 7. No charge, but bookings are essential, telephone 526 4133 during office hours. No dogs please.

HOW TO GET THERE: Kaitoke Regional Park is 45 km north of Wellington. Follow State Highway 2 and turn left at Waterworks Road 12 km north of Upper Hutt. Drive to the end of the road - signposted as the Pakuratahi Forks car park.

Tuesday 29 January 2002

Weeds Walk

Queen Elizabeth Park, MacKays Crossing, Paekakariki - 9.30 to 11am

Wander through the coastal dunes at Queen Elizabeth Park with Michael Urlich, Biosecurity Officer (Plants) looking at pest plants. Identify weeds and learn how to control them. Bring any weeds that you would like identified. Bring sturdy shoes, warm clothes, drinking water and a sun hat.

HOW TO GET THERE: Queen Elizabeth Park is 45km from Wellington on State Highway 1. Enter the Park at MacKays Crossing, signposted 3km north of Paekakariki, just over the railway crossing. Follow the sealed road 2km to Whareroa Beach.

Coastal Dunes Walk

Queen Elizabeth Park, MacKays Crossing, Paekakariki - 9.30am start

Join ecologist Paul Blaschke and discover the fascinating environment of Queen Elizabeth Park coastal dunes. Bring sturdy shoes, warm clothes, drinking water, a sun hat and snack or picnic lunch.

HOW TO GET THERE: See Weeds Walk above.

Nature Discovery Treasure Hunt

Kaitoke Regional Park, Waterworks Road - 11am start

An easy 1-1.5 hour guided family nature discovery treasure hunt walk through beautiful native forest. Bring a pen, warm clothes, drinking water, a sun hat and picnic lunch.

HOW TO GET THERE: Kaitoke Regional Park is 45 km north of Wellington. Follow State Highway 2 and turn left at Waterworks Road 12 km north of Upper Hutt. Drive to the end of the road - signposted as the Pakuratahi Forks car park.

Belmont Regional Park - 7pm start

Meet the Ranger for a brief (1-hour) presentation in the Woolshed, which outlines the human and natural forces that shaped the Belmont Hills landscape we see today.

HOW TO GET THERE: From Wellington follow State Highway 2 and take the Dowse Drive (Maungaraki) motorway turn-off (1.5km north of Petone). Turn left into Stratton Street at St Aidan's Church. The Woolshed is at the end of Stratton Street (3km).

Nikau Track Nature Trail

Wainuiomata Waterworks Recreation Area - 10am to midday

Bring the family along for a fun nature trail guiz. Bring warm clothes, a sun hat, a drink and snack or picnic lunch.

HOW TO GET THERE: Catch the 9.05am train from Wellington to Waterloo Interchange and a No. 62 bus to the end of Hine Road. Walk over the footbridge to Reservoir Road. By car, head through Wainuiomata on Main Road towards the Coast Road. Turn left into Moores Valley Road and then right into Whitcher Grove, which leads to Reservoir Road. Park before the gates.

Sunday 17 February 2002

US Marines' History Walk

Queen Elizabeth Park, MacKays Crossing - 9.30 start

During World War Two, there were three US Marines' camps located in or near the Park. Find out from Diane Brown (Paekakariki Historic Society) about the encampments of the 1st and 2nd Divisions of the US Marines Corps. Bring sturdy shoes, warm clothes, drinking water, a sun hat and snack or picnic lunch.

We walk from here up to the historic 1859 Pencarrow Lighthouse and to view Lakes Kohangatera and Kohangapiripiri and associated wetlands. Wear sturdy shoes or boots. Bring warm clothes, drinking water and picnic lunch. Maximum 45 people, \$5/adult, \$2/child U14. Bookings are essential, telephone 526 4133 during office hours. No dogs please.

HOW TO GET THERE: Take an Eastbourne bus to the terminal at the end of Muritai Road - then a short walk (400m) to Burdans Gate. Alternatively, catch the East by West ferry (cycles carried) from Queens Wharf, across the Harbour to Days Bay then catch a bus from there. 
