Procurement Opportunity for Regional Trains and Feasibility Study for Auckland Region

Greater Wellington Regional Council is currently procuring a new fleet of 4-car Independently Powered Electrical Multiple Units (IPEMU). These units will be used to provide services in the Lower North Island between Wellington and Masterton, and Wellington and Palmerston North.

We are writing to inform you that the tender process for Lower North Island Rail Integrated Mobility (LNIRIM) Programme has now commenced. We recently released a Request for Proposal (RFP) to the shortlisted proponents. We are aiming to sign the rolling stock and long-term maintenance contract by mid-2025.

Recognising the need for similar rail services across the country, the procurement includes provisions for other agencies to 'piggyback' off our contract and procurement documents. This allows you a base to negotiate from for the supply of trains, recognising that different regions will have different requirements with regards to the motive power of trains and rail network configurations (for example platform heights). In addition, we are also seeking a price for an option to manufacture trains with metro configuration for the Wellington metro area.

We are open to facilitating a LNIRIM Programme briefing session to provide more details on the provisions, draft contract terms, and the contract award timeline.
